

This is a must read autobiography. I never thought I could read about the rise and fall of a company I cared so much about and yet find myself laughing and my attention riveted throughout all the ups and downs. Phil Vischer carries the reader through his entire journey with characteristic wit and humor. At its height his company rivaled Pixar in size and yet Phil watched as it dissolved before his eyes. Phil looks back on his experience and speaks wisely about what he has learned from his journey. This book is an excellent read for anyone in business, religion, finance, graphic design or really anyone interested in a few talking vegetables and their world altering impact. This is a story that you can't miss so go out buy a copy and laugh along!

...this book will help you put the experience's pain and anguish into a right, proper, *biblical* perspective. I know it did for me having been through myriad trials of my own--can't say "thank you, Phil!" too many times! Vischer goes on to detail how he plans to place his focus on seeking God's will first and foremost in his work, his relationships, his *life*. Anyone reading through to the end can't help but be encouraged and feel called to do likewise. To have the impact we desire, doing it the *right* way. God's way.

I read a lot of books (probably 80+ on my Kindle) and many are inspiring. But Me, Myself, and Bob is going to alter my spiritual matrix. This book has caused me to dig up my "spiritual vegetable garden" and replant with new seed. God is "pulling out by the roots" my "dream plants" and giving me "new vegetables" from His great "heavenly garden". This bio gets to the "root" of the problem of many of us who feel called to be "sowers" in God's kingdom: wrong motives, spiritual pride and working overtime to heal hurt pockets we developed in childhood (like ulcers not caused by eating tomatoes and cucumbers but by what is eating at us). This book contains magic beans (like Jack got for his cow) that I believe will lead you higher than Jack's bean stalk...all the way to heaven and God's plan for your life. Let this beautiful story of brokenness and healing be a "refreshing rain" on the "vegetable garden" of your life.

This is a well told story of what happened to Phil Vischer as God worked on His life. C. S. Lewis

gives the illustration of God making repairs (e.g. eliminating leaks and squeaks) when we invite him into our "house". Soon after that, God breaks down some walls, causing us great pain. It is only later that we are able to see He is transforming our cottage into a castle that He will live in. This is one such story, reminding us that God can be trusted, whether we have much or little. Brilliantly narrated. Plenty of lessons to pick along. I highly recommend it.
