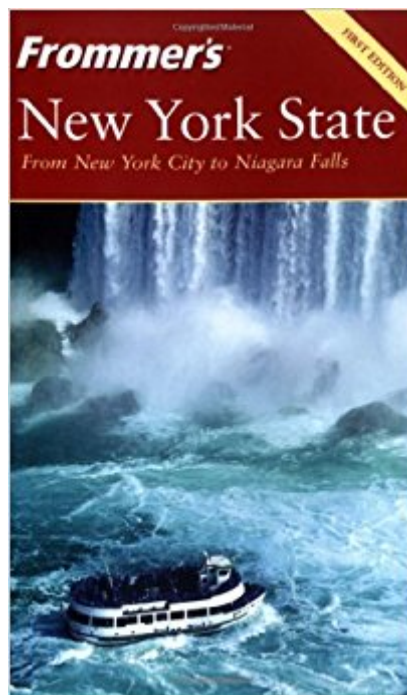

Frommer's New York State, 4th edition, is a fairly useful book. I found that it had good information on the locations it covered. However, there is no information at all on some cities. For instance, we were going to Oswego on a recent trip, and it is not mentioned in any way. We did find some helpful information on most of our destinations on our recent trip to upstate New York.

It's hard to find a guide book that actually covers all of New York State, but this one does a great job. There are features on small towns, the cities and everything in between. It's organized by region, which is quite helpful for a large, oddly-shaped state like New York.
