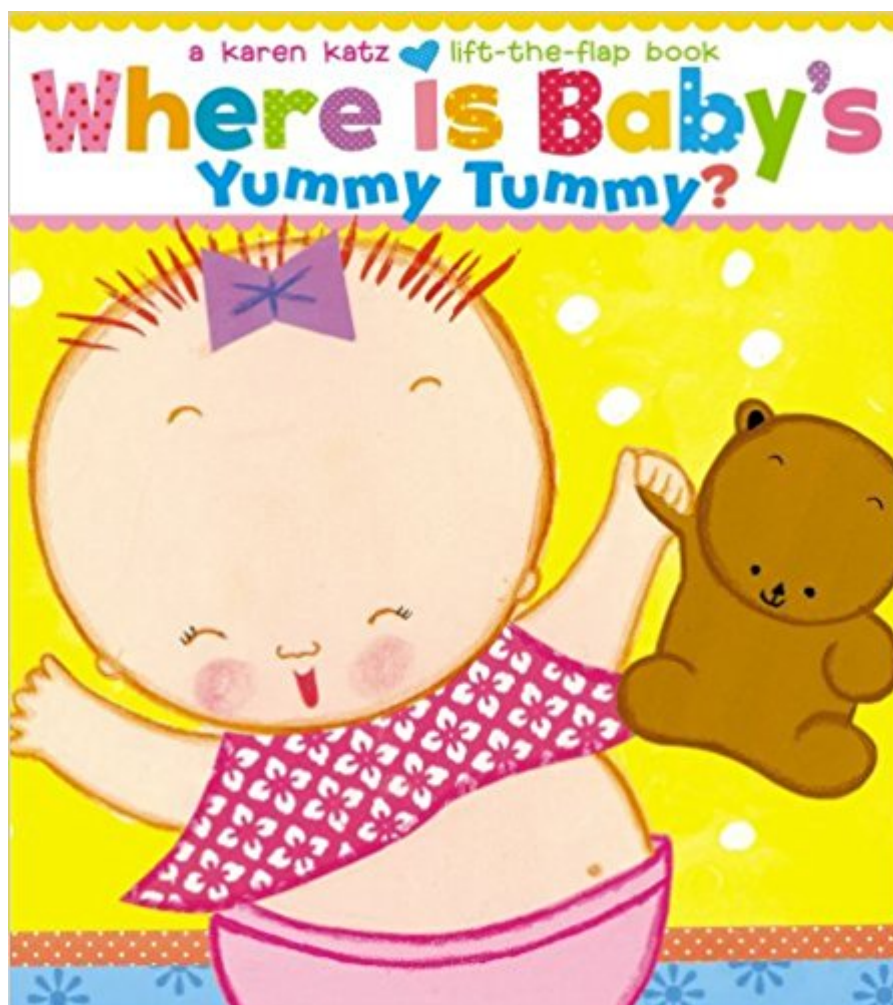

Katz's characteristically chubby and happy babies are at the center of this peek-a-boo book. "Where are baby's feet/ that are/ good enough/ to eat?" asks the opening spread. The answer (and the feet) are revealed under a floral flap ("Under the blanket!"). A gleeful baby's knees are behind a colorful beach ball, and a baby's "tushy/ that's soft/ and smooshy" peeks out from under the baby's diaper. A tender way for parents to bond with their infants. An encouraging voice calls for the location of each sweet and cuddly body part. Beginning with the toes, each gentle question follows a consistent rhyming format. From feet â œgood enough to eatâ • to a nose â œas

pretty as a rose,â•tykes of various ethnicities play an active role in their exploration. The perspective zooms in on the jovial babes, giving them every inch of each page. Katz's signature solid spreads incorporate clean patterns with light details. The strategic flaps placed in different corners use objects commonly found in daily life (blanket, teddy bear) to fully hide each featured choice. The coy text playfully calls for audience participation. âœWhere is baby's tushy / that's soft and smooshy?â•; a naked behind peeks from underneath a diaper when the flap is pulled down. 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My 1-year old daughter absolutely loves the books in these series, her favorite being "Where is Baby's Bellybutton?" So when I came across this book while browsing, I knew she was going to love it. And she does! This book is less "wordy" than some of the others ("Baby Loves Summer" has more words than a 1-year old will sit through before she starts pulling on the flaps) which makes it perfect for reading with a 1-year old. The illustrations are great, as always, and the flaps themselves are in fun shapes that she loves to lift. All in all the whole family is very happy with this book, and reads it over and over!

Toddler loves flipping through the pages and lifting the flaps. The Karen Katz books are all a big hit

with her. The peek-a-boo format seems to really work. The book is very short, and the flaps are a bit on the flimsy side--not terrible, but not indestructible--so I do feel it best not to leave baby alone with this one.

Our first Karen Katz book and we're not impressed. The flaps are rather flimsy and my son (13mth) does not seem to like the drawings. He generally loves books, but this one seems to be his least favorite and 8 out of 10 times he will push it away when I try to read it with him.

Very cute story with fun peek-a-boo tabs! Wish it was a little longer or more creative though. Not one of my daughters favorite books, but we still enjoy it.

When we noticed our 11-month old was infatuated with "Where is Baby's Pumpkin?", which is very similar to this book, we bought her this one as well. She just loves to lift the flaps on every page. These books have been great for introducing her to story time, and manage to keep her attention from start to finish.

I searched and searched for books for my son. I especially wanted books from the same author so I may start a series. I have found these to be wonderful. I enjoy reading them and my son loves them and has since he was just a few months old.

My grandson LOVES this series of board books with flaps to open. Do require some supervision as the flaps will tear if "baby handled"!

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
