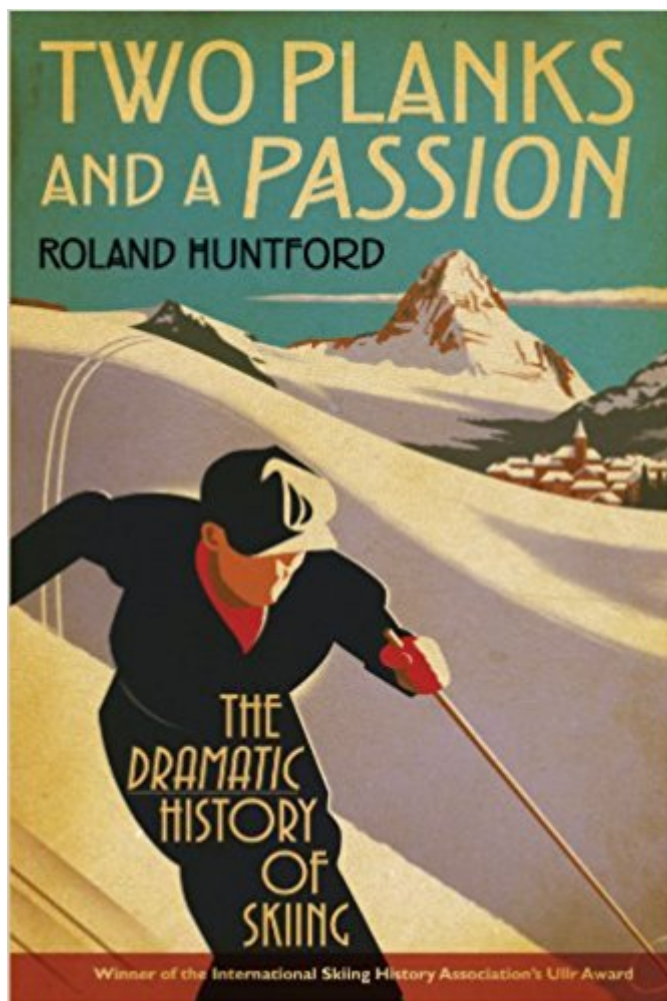




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Two Planks And A Passion: The Dramatic History Of Skiing

Roland Huntford is the world's foremost authority on the polar expeditions and their protagonists. He is the author of the award-winning Two Planks and a Passion: the Dramatic History of Skiing and Scott and Amundsen: Last Place on Earth and he is the biographer of Shackleton and Nansen. He was the Scandinavian correspondent on The Observer for many years.

If you're serious about the early history of skiing, Huntford's book is essential reading. There are now a number of very good academic English-language studies of the history and culture of skiing in the modern era (beginning with the eighteenth century), but Huntford is the best scholarly work on the sport's prehistory -- that is, on over-snow travel by the preliterate peoples of Northern and Central Eurasia. Excellent, authoritative detail on the transfer of skills that led to the adoption of Scandinavian skiing in the Alps, on the relationship between wintersport and nineteenth century nationalism. Huntford is a polyglot and was able to do most of his research by reading sources in their original languages. The book is not flawless, but it's a gem and should serve as a starting point for any further research into the history of the sport in Europe. And it's fun to read. --Seth Masia, [...]

Like others have mentioned, this book thoroughly covers the history of skiing up to WWII, and crams the last 70 years into a single chapter at the end. If you're looking for the "modern" history of skiing, then this isn't the book for you. The portion of history that is covered is thorough and well researched with notes and a full bibliography. This book isn't what I expected. It is good for the prehistoric info about skiing but is too technical and over-worded for the rest of skiing history and doesn't come up into a modern enough time period. It misses some of the recent short, shaped ski developments and their impact on alpine racing and ski instruction.

I have a whole bookshelf of ski books, mostly history. This one is my favorite and if you have a PASSION for skiing, this is the best one. I was stunned to see the tepid reviews of this book. Less dry than "From Skisport to Skiing" and certainly covering a much longer time period, with a world, rather than US, focus. My only quibble, as with many of these histories, is that more recent events are given short shrift. A decent amount of pictures adds to the better understanding of earlier times.
