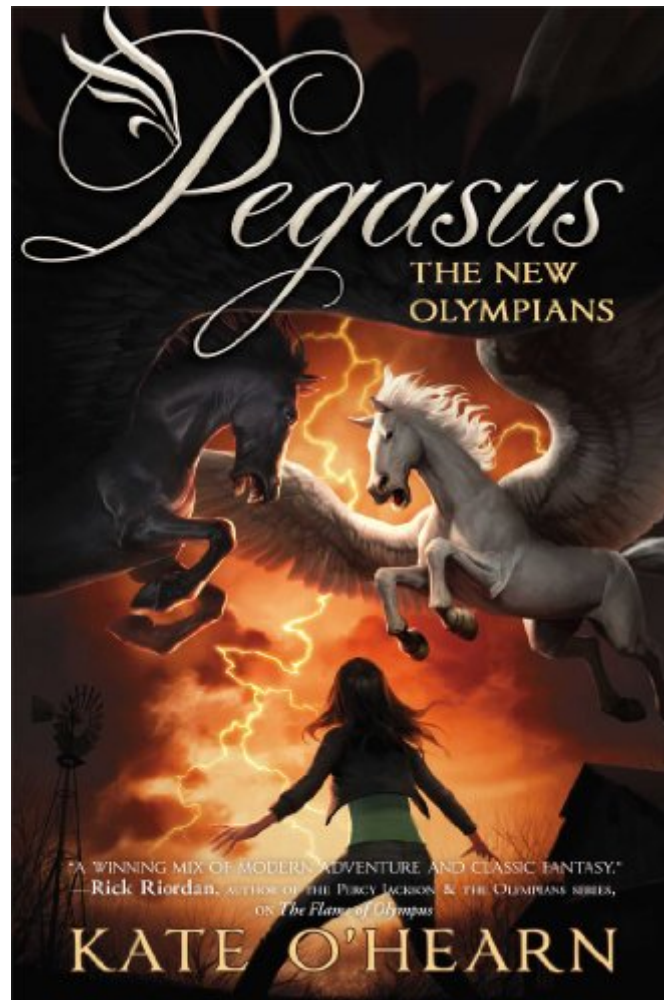


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The New Olympians (Pegasus Book 3)

However the violence is a bit on the strong side with vengeful anger and super powers getting out of control. Still I always loved the myth about Pegasus.
