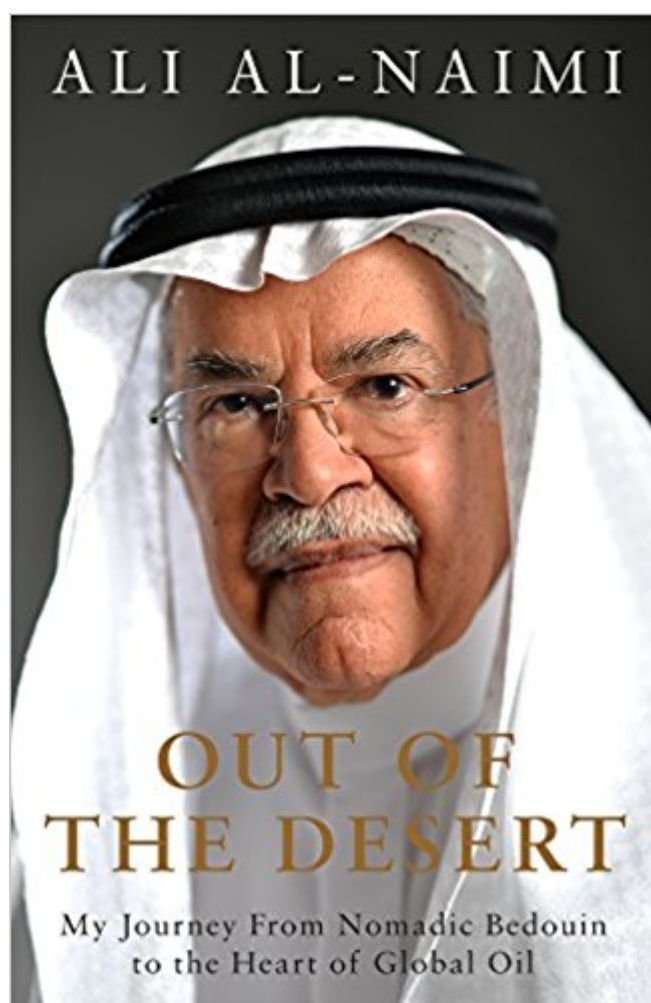

His Excellency Ali Ibrahim Al-Naimi was Minister of Petroleum and Mineral Resources for the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, from 1995 to May 2016. He is a member of the Cabinet of the Council of Ministers and the Supreme Economic Council. From 1995 until 2015, he was Chairman of the Kingdom's national oil company, Saudi Aramco. He is also Chairman of the Saudi Geological Society and of the King Abdullah University of Science and Technology. He is routinely named on international power lists, including the Time World's 100 Most Influential People and The Times's GulfPower25.

This is an excellent book, written by a man who knows every aspect of the oil business from first hand experience as an engineer, manager, executive and oil minister. It takes the reader to the desert, the processing plants, the boardrooms and the global venues. It provides a remarkable combination of detail and global considerations. I have read many books about oil and this is the best and most informative.

This book has special interest to me because I was in the World Oil Business myself and had met his predecessor in Cairo several years ago. His story reminded me of a story of a young man in the early 20th of century who made it much like Ali Al-Naimi did. This is one of the books I will be discussing with a special reading group I belong to whose focus is mainly on world economic issues. One of the comments I made to my friends in this group made me want to get out into the World Oil Business again, this time, with a much better understanding of how to be more successful at meeting the needs of the company I worked for and the needs of the government agents I was talking to. What surprised me the most is how Ali Al-Naimi used the resources available to him to make it possible for the people of his country and others to advance their education. This man is an extra special man and I feel honored by having a chance to read his book

I, like many Saudis and members of oil industry, have huge respect for Mr. Al Naimi and I was eager

to read this book. That said and without dismissing the value of this work, I found this book reflects many negative sentiments about how he progressed throughout his career and the selection criteria for leading oil men he chose such as the one he promoted based on single encounter in a presentation session. Above all, I was looking forward for shedding light on the controversies around major events he was part of such as the rise and fall of international gas initiative (despite what the author tried to avoid, he sounded against it from the initial talks). It is also evident that he deliberately overlooked the events that led to the selection of KAF as a CEO and later as minister since he talked adequately about Juma'ah's story. In addition, the KAUST chapter includes many negative connotations that are evident throughout the story. For instance, the story attempts to emphasize the effective use of time, but at the same time, it reflects a state of emergency!. Shortcutting and rushing everything against the opinions of world's experts regarding the reasonable time to build an institution with such agenda can equally reflect what could be perceived as ego and/or major misjudgment. In addition and notwithstanding the surprising \$10 billion endowment that may be attributable to poor planning, making 75% error in estimating the endowment and resorting again to the king for additional fund is enough to understate the whole KAUST story, it questions the quality and basis for estimating the first \$10 billion and the qualifications of the highly paid consultants and experts. Furthermore, it unintentionally reflects another negative connotation against king Abdullah as if he was naive and unaware of what a university budget should involve. While Mr. Al Naimi is renowned for his career in oil business, he was equally responsible for the mineral resources sector. However, he did not cover the challenges he faced in this sector leaving many interesting stories unattended. Moreover, I don't believe that the author really wanted to say that the policymakers in Saudi Arabia became aware of the runaway energy demand only after the paper presented by Chatham House. I truly hope that these points to be considered in future editions.

I enjoyed Mr Al Naimi's book and found it extremely interesting. I met him several times while working at ARAMCO aviation, as their special flights coordinator. He was always a perfect gentleman and worked very hard to get to be the oil minister. I wish him the best of happiness and good health in his long overdo retirement.
