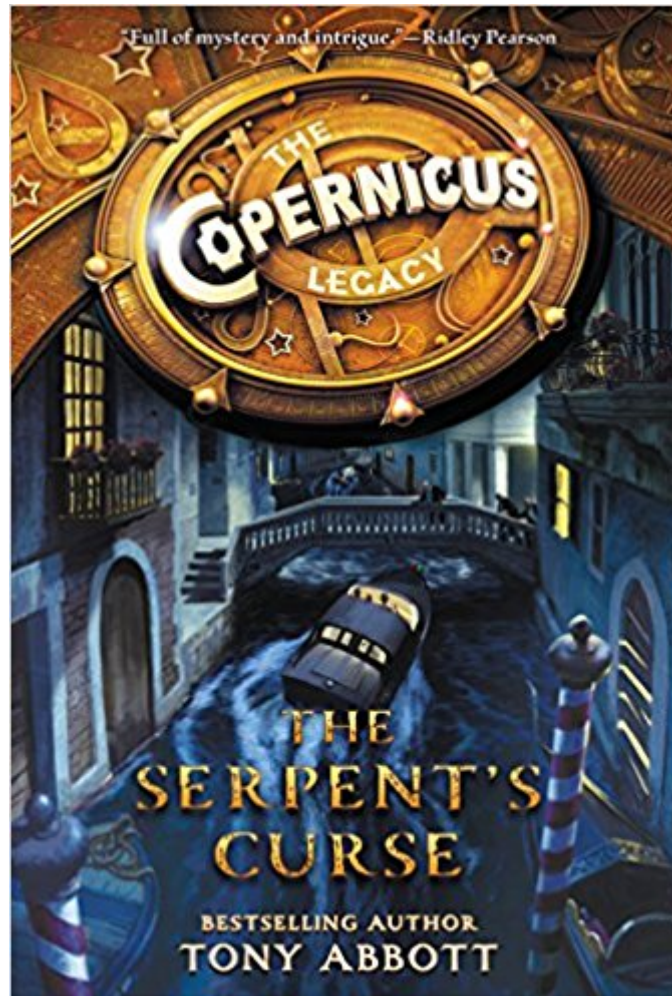

The Copernicus Legacy: The Serpent's Curse



Bestselling author Tony Abbott returns with the next full-length book in the Copernicus Legacy series, a globe-trotting adventure packed with more riddles, puzzles, and secret histories. The hunt for Copernicus's first relic sent Wade, Darrell, Lily, and Becca to the far reaches of the world and put them in serious danger. But they never imagined Sara KaplanâDarrell and Wade's motherâwould be kidnapped by the conniving Galina Krause. Now they must race the evil Teutonic Order to find the Serpens relic and rescue Sara before it's too late. Gr 4â “6â ”Still reeling from their last adventure in *The Forbidden Stone* (HarperCollins, 2014) which ended only hours before, Wade, Darrell, Becca, and Lily are nearly killed by Galina and the evil Order. So begins another around-the-globe hunt for one of 12 mysterious relics that can reactivate a time-traveling astrolabe built by Nicolas Copernicus. But the relic is not the only valuable thing the group is searching for: they must find and rescue Darrell’s mother, kidnapped by Galina’s thugs.

Codes and riddles point the way to the hidden relic, and though readers are unable to participate in solving the puzzles, they will have fun witnessing the characters use their complementary skills to work together and find the answers. The novel's challenge is its length: multiple plotlines and secondary characters are interesting but numerous enough to slow down the otherwise fast-paced narrative. Moderate violence (stabbing, shooting, poisoning, and explosions) contrasts with occasional juvenile phrases such as, "Wade had been giving Becca goo-goo eyesâ |" and "you are being tremendously awesome". References to the companion novella, *The Copernicus Archives: Wade and the Scorpion's Claw*, (HarperCollins, 2014) whose events take place after the first novel and before this title, add another layer. Readers learn a bit more about each of the four young heroes in this second installment, but those wishing for more character development will want to read the novellas. This book is everything you would expect from the previous book. It, like th book before it, is very well written, with actual history events and places mixed very well into the fantasy of Abbott's world. The book is generally well paced, with some slow parts in the middle. The action is very good, especially when the wonderfully written villianess Galina is involved. I absolutely love that Abbott explains from Galina's POV why she doesn't just kill the Kaplans when she sees them. Both a pro and a con, this books is very long. On the plus side, Abbott does Avery good job at fleshing out the story and the main characters, while managing to add in some very interesting minor characters. On the minus side, there are many minor characters, and while a few are very memorable, some take bit to recall if you've set the book down for a while. Also, because of its long length, I don't recommend reading this on a small reading device, such as a phone or small tablet. The sheer size of the book can be a bit overwhelming and is much easier to read on a bigger screen. All in all, very good sequel, and if you enjoyed "The Forbidden Stone", you will most certainly enjoy this book.

I would recommend this book to people in 7th grade through about the later years of high school because lots of difficult language is used, complicated topics, and hard coded to cipher.
