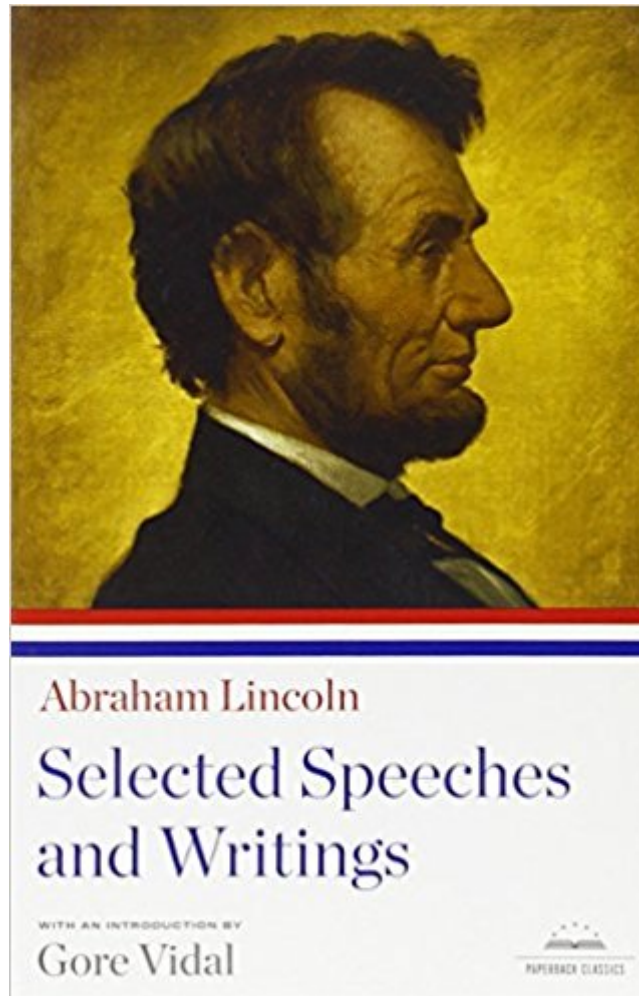


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Abraham Lincoln: Selected Speeches And Writings (Library Of America)

They record Lincoln's campaigns for public office; the evolution of his stand against slavery; his electrifying debates with Stephen Douglas; his conduct of the Civil War; and the great public utterances of his presidency, including the Emancipation Proclamation and the Gettysburg Address. Gore Vidal (1925-2012) was the author of numerous novels -- the first, *Williwaw*, written when he was twenty-one -- as well as scripts for film, television and the stage, including the extremely successful *The Best Man* and *Visit to a Small Planet*. He is perhaps best known for his historical novels, including *Burr* (1973), *1876* (1976), and *Lincoln* (1984). He won the National Book Award in 1993 for his book of essays, *United States* (1952-1992).

I have the Dover Thrift Edition of Abraham Lincoln's Great Speeches which whet my appetite and curiosity for more communications of this great leader. My appetite was whet even more by the movie "Lincoln". I believe that if our current politicians had the ability to communicate as well as Lincoln (and the time to write their own speeches and letters) there would be less follow-up explanations and retractions. As an example I would offer the letter Lincoln wrote to Horace Greeley on August 22, 1862. I'm sure there are many, including the recipient, who disagreed with the views offered in this letter; but I don't think anyone could mistake the views of the person writing the letter. One needs to be aware that these are 'selected' offerings and that some of the speeches are edited for brevity. I have just begun to pursue a look into what this man said and its impact on our history and our current situation. I believe that this book will serve me well in that 'look' and would heartily recommend it. The Modern Library hardbound version in two volumes would be my next choice.
