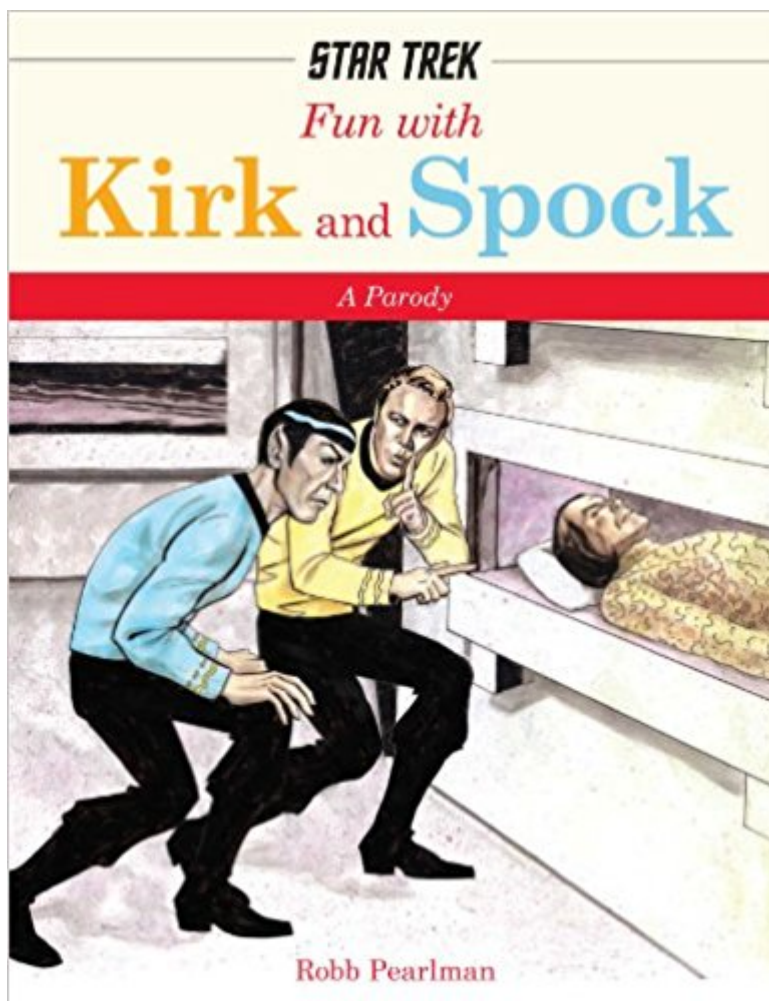

Nice for what it is / A disappointment for what it is not.
Pro: It is a nice tongue-in-cheek send up of TOS.
Cons: Despite its art and language style, and even its form factor, it is *NOT* a book that you can read to/with your children. Replete with adult concepts and language (e.g. "dead Tellarite", "murderous children controlled by a megalomaniacal non-corporeal entity"), it will not be (as hoped) a gateway to introduce my kids to the show I love and will one day share with them. As such, it has no re-readability.
Final word: Fun once. Appropriate for adults only; not a gateway for youngsters to get excited about Star Trek. If I do not give it away -or- redact it, it will languish on the shelf as an \$8 "one off".

A thorough knowledge of Star Trek TOS is required to enjoy this book. Anyone else probably won't appreciate it. A few good laughs for the trekkies.
